

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

Conecuh Sausage has taken over Alabama. You'll find it at breakfast next to the eggs on your plate and in the white gravy. It's there again on your lunch flatbread. You can wrap up a long day of golf with a serving of sausage in your shrimp and grits. Name a recipe, and the cooks in Alabama will find a way to inject a little Conecuh Sausage. Vegans beware.

The sausages are made in the small town of Evergreen in the southern reaches of this very Southern state, and the brand has become an icon of civic pride. Judging from my recent week of golf in Alabama, it would be safe to say the little bundles of meat make up a sizable percentage of the entire state's total caloric intake. I sampled nine meals on the trip that didn't come through a drive-through window, and seven of them included at least one Conecuh Sausage concoction on the plate.

About the only thing more prevalent in Alabama than the sausage is the tasty golf along the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail. With 26 courses at 11 sites stretched across the state - 468 holes in all - the Trail pretty much dominates the golf scene in the state. Eight of the top 10 courses on Golfweek's "Best Courses You Can Play" list of top public-access layouts in the state are part of the Trail.

Many of the best of those stretch across the middle of the state, beginning with the Lake Course at Grand National in Opelika, which ranks No. 4 on Golfweek's Best 2021 list for Alabama. Take Interstate 85 southwest to Prattville near Montgomery for the Judge at Capitol Hill, which is No. 3 in the state. Then jump onto I-65 for the ride north to Hoover near Birmingham for 36 more at No. 2 Ross Bridge and No. 6 Oxmoor Valley's Ridge Course.

That was the majority of my itinerary in early January as I set out to lay eyes on the best of public-access golf in the state, all with the burning intent of settling this question: Where should I play golf in Alabama? There were scenic mountain holes, lakeside par 3s, incredibly long layouts for those foolish enough to play from the wrong tees, even a few birdie putts that found the cup. Did I mention the Conecuh Sausage? It really is everywhere.

GRAND NATIONAL: THE LAKE

Dr. David Bronner, CEO of the Retirement Systems of Alabama, conceived the Trail as a way to boost economic growth and diversify the state's pension fund. Famed course architect Robert Trent Jones Sr. and his team of designers - which included much lead detail work by Roger Rulewich - reshaped Alabama into a prime golf destination with initial plans that included 378 holes at eight sites across the state.

The concept has only grown since its introduction in the 1980s. Hotels, restaurants, shops, merchandise - the Trail is an enterprise-level effort that makes it easy to bounce from site-to-site, playing golf across multiple landscapes without ever leaving the Trail system. It was rapidly recognized as a perfect setup for buddies trips, with miles of green fairways to keep groups of any size swinging, always with more holes to play.

Four of the sites opened in 1992 to widespread acclaim, including Grand National at Opelika near Auburn. This story begins there.

In keeping with the buddies theme, I recruited a friend, Matt Matin of Winter Garden, Florida. A single-digit handicapper and golf nut, Matin would help keep the focus on the core tenet of the Trail: more golf. Also, he's a sucker for a press.

After an easy drive from Florida and a night in the Auburn Marriott Opelika Resort & Spa at Grand National, Matin and I woke up early to a breakfast of eggs and a side of - what else? - Conecuh Sausage at the onsite Southern Oak restaurant. The view out the back windows focuses not on golf but on pool fun - it was easy to surmise this stop on the Trail is more than a golf site. Outdoor food and bar, multiple pools, and all the trappings of a day in the sun would make it easy to forget there are 36 full-size holes and par-3 course beyond the

pool deck. The resort added a three-story spa and upgraded its restaurants in 2018. The hotel features 19 luxury suites.


But we were there in January, like so many others searching for a golf escape in the relative safety of a car during the COVID-19 pandemic, and the pool deck was empty. Didn't matter. The No. 4 publicaccess course in Alabama was waiting, and this 18's name said it all.

The Lake Course - formerly the home of the PGA Tour's Barbasol Championship hugs the shores of Lake Saugahatchee, and it took just three holes for a theme to develop: scenic but difficult par 3s over or alongside dominating water hazards. The Lake Course features four of them ranging from 197 to 230 yards off the back tees. That theme holds up all along the Trail, with the oneshotters often set above the most compelling water features and stealing the show.

The best of them at the Lake Course might be No. 15, with its green set on a peninsula above the water. I say this not only because I hit the green and made a casual par to flip a press with Matin, but because the tee shot to the peninsula is stunning.









Pretty as they are, the steady drumbeat of watery par 3s on the Trail might not be for everyone, as they become a bit familiar after a couple of rounds - architecture aficionados might lift their chins at so many forced carries. I sometimes cringe when courses advertise their "best set of par 3s around," because I know I am likely to face several long, penal challenges with few reasonable bailouts. But the fact is, these watery Trail holes tend to be stunners when each is considered on its own. So while the theme might become a bit familiar, at least it's a familiarity with beauty.

When not hugging the shoreline, the Lake Course moves through wonderfully rolling terrain. The shortish, uphill par-5 fourth was a favorite, offering several options both off the tee and from the fairway, with a multi-level green that easily can lead to one of the most frustrating terms in golf: three-putt par.

Likewise, the downhill par-4 11th stood out. The terrain provides all the challenge off the tee, as the hole plays much narrower than its corridor through the trees might suggest, with not a single fairway sand trap needed to make the tee shot interesting. The second shot is slightly back uphill to a beast of a green that slopes back to front with a severe roll-off to the right. This hole proves the point that there are more ways to grab attention than with heavy bunkering or water - great ground can do the job nicely.

All in all, a great start to five days of golf: solid, fun, and challenging, not a snoozer on the scorecard. Even after Matin pitched in on No. 18 from an impossibly short-sided lie to grab the match by a shot, it was all smiles for the 80-minute drive to Prattville after the round. Game on.

CAPITOL HILL: THE JUDGE AND THE SENATOR

While the Auburn Marriott Opelika Resort & Spa at Grand National is a great non-golf spot for family trips, with its expansive pool deck and outdoor activities, the Montgomery Marriott Prattville Hotel & Conference Center at Capitol Hill is perfect for a buddies stay. After a recent renovation, it overlooks several of the 54 holes of golf that lie just beyond.

Large groups can skip the main lodge altogether. This property features two eight-room villas and a 10,000-square-foot Presidential Cottage with a private helicopter landing pad. The villas would be perfect for a group of golfers to stay under one roof, keeping the laughs going long after the day's golf is finished. And the Presidential Cottage, with its secluded outdoor patio, is a natural fit for wedding parties or corporate retreats. Something for everyone.

Another feature at Capitol Hill that any golfer should enjoy: the view from the first tee of the Judge, which is No. 3 among Golfweek's "Best Courses You Can Play in Alabama." The tee sits more than 100 feet above the lake-lined fairway below, providing one of the most inspiring opening tee shots found anywhere. It's not just aweinspiring; it's also fear-inspiring. We were supposed to hit that ribbon of fairway, and the target looks incredibly skinny from high above – only after reaching the fairway do you realize there's slightly more room available than what appears from the tee.

And so it was off to the races on a very difficult track through the backwaters of the Alabama River. The par 3s again stand out, with three of the four equally suited to cameras as to golf clubs, perched as they are in beautiful waterside settings.

The most difficult of the short holes and I use the word "short" with a smile when it comes to this 7.813-vard course - that day proved not to be the 229-yard, island-green sixth, but the 231-yard 12th that is all carry to one of the toughest targets you would ever want to four-putt, as Matin proved.

The yardages for the Judge mentioned above bring up an important point: Do not even consider tackling the wrong tee boxes on these Trail courses. Robert Trent Jones Sr. had no apprehensions about building difficult golf courses, and it's no fun to shoot a high score and play slow. Each course offers a slew of teeing grounds, and if you're looking to play from a yardage that's in between posted options, move up to the shorter boxes. Come to think of it, move up anyways.

The 18th is the shortest par 4 on the Judge and packs a lot into a small package. It plays 358 off the back to an uphill green, and after fighting for pars most of the day, my birdie there put me back on the proper side of the ledger against Matin. We were scheduled for a quick lunch and another 80-minute drive to the next course.

But the Senator vetoed that early car ride, demanding attention before we slid off our spikes.

All the courses at Capitol Hill have official-sounding names - the Judge, Senator, and Legislator - as the state capital is just eight miles away. But as the wintry breezes kicked up a bit under clear, sunny skies, it wasn't the name but the terrain that grabbed our attention.

The Senator is nothing like the Judge. On higher land with a Scottish-links theme, the Senator is wide open, barely a tree in play. Yellow grasses danced in the wind as we

weighed our options: get to the next hotel early and hang out, or play more golf. That was an easy call.

The Senator - the former host site of the Yokohama Tire LPGA Classic - does not, of course, play exactly like a true links course. But it did recently receive a makeover with TifEagle Ultradwarf greens that play impressively fast and firm, sitting high and dry above the lakeside setting of the Judge course below. And while the Senator is not in the top 10 on Golfweek's "Best Courses You Can Play in Alabama," it certainly could be. Because it's a blast.

Laced with more than 160 pot bunkers amid 20- to 40-foot mounds, the Senator in a breeze presents dozens of ways to play most of its holes, which is liberating after 18 on the more-demanding Judge. Matin and I raced the sun's descent, finishing just before dark and thrilled to have seen two such different layouts at one site on the same day.

ROSS BRIDGE AND OXMOOR VALLEY

We've established that the Auburn Marriott Opelika Resort & Spa at Grand National is a premium family destination and the Marriott at Prattville is perfect for a buddies golf trip or corporate retreat. The AAA Four Diamond Renaissance Birmingham Ross Bridge Golf Resort & Spa steps up the opulence a bit, making it a prime location for a special trip with a spouse. Think chandeliers and luxurious suites - a special anniversary-type setting, no doubt.

After jumping from hotel to hotel on backto-back nights, Matin and I were scheduled for two nights at the Renaissance, and it was great to unpack a bit. As an added bonus, the hotel serves two sites on the Trail, with Oxmoor Valley just minutes away and Ross Bridge out the back windows.

Oxmoor Valley's Ridge Course ranks No. 6 on Golfweek's Best 2021 list for public-access courses in the state, with holes climbing and diving through tree lines and 150 feet of Appalachian Mountain elevation changes. The hilly setting doesn't feature much water and doesn't need it to create interest.

A favorite hole was the par-4 14th, which tops out at 389 yards on the card but plays longer. The fairway makes excellent use of the terrain, doglegging left around a 40foot hill dotted with three bunkers. The tee shot dares you to cut the corner, but that hill has a mind of its own, blocking shots and obscuring sight lines after a misplaced drive. The green sits at the hole's highest point and needs no bunkers to provide an interesting approach shot. It's a beautiful use of topography without exaggerated hazards.

After our morning 18, Matin and I were scheduled for an afternoon off. But what fun is that? We darted five minutes back down the road to the Renaissance and tried to squeeze in a bonus 18 at Ross Bridge, the No. 2 public-access course in Alabama. With the early winter twilight, we fought a losing battle against nightfall.

But it didn't take long to appreciate Ross Bridge. The parkland setting takes full

advantage of two lakes, and the scale of the place sets it apart. Wide fairways, perfectly rolling terrain, great green complexes, and chipping surrounds - it's completely understandable how Ross Bridge jumped to the No. 2 spot in Alabama in 2021.

Again, the par 3s are brutes, with two of them - Nos. 4 and 14 - requiring forced carries over water. The other two par 3s lack the water but also necessitate long carries over inclines to reach the greens. No. 6 was especially gorgeous in the evening light, with long views and open sky.

We didn't get to finish the round that night, stopping after No. 13 to dash over to play the closer in the near darkness. We had another round on Ross Bridge planned the next day, and as we dined at the nearby Front Porch restaurant - try the candied bacon bombs if you need a break from all the Conecuh Sausage - we turned a wary eye to the next day's weather forecast. It wasn't going to be pretty.

Wind and storms rolled in that night as a cold front blasted Alabama. We figured there would be no chance to play and happily ate breakfast - eggs with a side of Conecuh Sausage, of course - safely inside the hotel. Resolved to our fate of no golf that day, we retreated to our rooms.

Then came a break in the clouds, plus a breakdown in our thinking. Ross Bridge is one of the five longest courses in the world, stretching 8,191 yards off the back tees, and there was nobody out there as the skies briefly parted. I goaded Matin into giving it a try as the temperature neared 40 degrees, and with no other groups to hold up, I declared an added challenge: Let's play the tips. It would be an adventure, I promised, and anyways, we could always go back inside if the weather got nasty.

I was half right. The weather soon closed back in around us, but instead of retreating, I cajoled Matin into playing onward from tees that stretched the course about 1,500 yards beyond our skills. With gusts surpassing 30 mph and rain sometimes coming in sideways, Matin and I aimed tee balls to any point of safety around Ross Bridge, clearly outgunned by this behemoth and trying to not lose too many balls on the forced carries into the tempest. We're both low-handicap players





and managed to beat it around in fewer than 90 strokes, and after several weeks to reflect on the experience, I can recognize it as an error while still fondly recalling all the bogeys and handful of pars.

But I wouldn't recommend such an adventure to anyone. Our idiotic attempt to play one of the world's longest courses in the freezing wind and rain proved nothing if not this: Pick the right tees.

I can promise that if Ross Bridge had not been such a beautiful golf course, even in

that rain, I would have spent the afternoon ignoring emails in my hotel room.

So that was the first four days of golf on this Alabama itinerary, with rounds played on the four highest-ranked courses on the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail plus one other. What more could anyone ask for?


That's the great thing about the best public-access golf in Alabama: There's something for everyone.

Mountain courses? Check. Long, hard courses? Plenty of those. Easier, wider courses? Yep.

Beautiful lakeside par 3s that belong in a painting? They're everywhere.

So back to the question that triggered this quest: Where's the best place to play golf in Alabama? All these top-ranked courses in the state are worthy, and altogether they make for an easy trip across the center of the state. Golfweek's raters have spoken. Now it's your turn to enjoy the drive and see them all. \blacksquare Reprinted with permission from Golfweek.

DAY 1 (morning) RTJ GOLF TRAIL AT MAGNOLIA GROVE

MILEPOST: 1

The morning and afternoon of your first day can be easily interchanged, but for our purposes, we'll have you starting at the Crossings Course at Magnolia Grove, a multiple-time host for the LPGA Tour. With a routing that meanders through pines and marshlands, this serene layout isn't short on scenery, and recent renovations have added waste areas of crushed oyster shells for even more ambiance. Your round here is a worthy kickoff to the journey that awaits.

DAY 1 (afternoon) RTJ GOLF TRAIL AT MAGNOLIA GROVE

MILEPOST: 1

No need to travel for your afternoon festivities, as your next destination sits on the same property as your morning 18. After lunch to recharge, head out for some hit-and-giggle fun on Magnolia Grove's Short Course, which was named one of *GOLF*'s 25-best par-3 courses in the world. Recent renovations have only enhanced it. A mixture of challenging tee shots and cleverly placed pins will require your A-game if you want to end your first day on the winning end of skins.

DAY 2 (morning) RTJ GOLF TRAIL AT CAMBRIAN RIDGE

MILEPOST: 131

A short drive up Interstate 65 takes you to Cambrian Ridge. This 36-hole facility is one of the most challenging stops on the Trail, and you won't be disappointed by the views either. Mix and match between the Canyon, Loblolly, and Sherling nines for some of the most breathtaking scenery in Butler County.

If you want to keep the driver in the bag, swing by the Short Course for nine holes of leisurely play.

DAY 2 (afternoon) U.S. CIVIL RIGHTS TRAIL

MILEPOST: 187

After your morning at Cambrian Ridge, it's on to Montgomery for an afternoon of education. The state capital holds a significant place in civil rights history, as the Alabama Capitol Building was the endpoint for the third march for voting rights, which began in Selma. Other local landmarks of the Civil Rights Movement include Dexter Avenue King Memorial Church, where Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. served as pastor; the site of Rosa Parks' arrest; and the courthouse of Judge Frank M. Johnson Jr., whose pivotal rulings helped end legal segregation in the South. All three of these towering figures spent significant portions of their lives in Montgomery, and their legacies are preserved in the capital city. Time spent learning about those who risked everything for their principles - and for the wellbeing of others — is time well spent.

DAY 3 (morning) RTJ GOLF TRAIL AT CAPITOL HILL

MILEPOST: 198

A quick drive northwest of the city sets you up for a round at one of Capitol Hill's three championship courses: the Judge, Legislator, and Senator. Each has a look and personality all its own, and there's no wrong whichever you choose. the Judge has amazing views along the Alabama River, while the Legislator weaves in and out of pine trees and marshland for a more traditional feel. The Senator can satisfy your craving for

a links-style layout, and the test will be stern. As the host of several Korn Ferry Tour events — most recently in 2019 it's a true championship track.

DAY 3 (afternoon) AUBURN UNIVERSITY

MILEPOST: 255

With the capital city in your rearview mirror, head east to Auburn, and the university that shares the city's name, to stroll the grounds of a proud SEC school. Head to Toomer's Corner, at the intersection between downtown Auburn and the Auburn University campus, and then pop into Toomer's Drugs for some fresh-squeezed lemonade and a bite to eat. If you time your trip correctly, you're pretty much required to attend a game at Jordan-Hare Stadium. A post-game drink at a bustling nearby campus bar is optional, but highly recommended. War Eagle!

DAY 4 (morning) RTJ GOLF TRAIL AT GRAND NATIONAL

MILEPOST: 263

As long as your hangover isn't too severe, make the quick drive over to Grand National for your grand finale. As at the other RTJ Golf Trail properties, you'll have options. On the Lake Course, more than half of the holes hug Lake Saugahatchee, and the vistas on its routing can't be beat. The course also plays host to the Symetra Tour, giving you yet another chance to test your game where the pros play. The Links Course is the cornerstone of Grand National and features four par-3s that can be fuddle even the most experienced players. Finish the trip off with a drink by the pool at the on-site Auburn Marriott Opelika Resort & Spa at Grand National, and make a toast to yourself on a trip well played (and well planned). ■ Reprinted with permission from GOLF.com.





Opened in 1847, the Grand Hotel Golf Resort & Spa's historian is ready to share stories about the "Queen of Southern Resorts" with longtime guests and first-time visitors. Across Mobile Bay, The Battle House Renaissance Mobile Hotel & Spa opened in 1852 and has a historian who started there in the early 1970s. Susan Stein and George Moore are exceptional hospitality ambassadors who bring the history of these iconic hotels to life. The Grand Hotel and The Battle House are part of the Resort Collection along the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail. Each of these eight hotels has an interesting history and nearby historic attractions for guests to explore. Stein and Moore are Alabama's only hotel historians and rank among the best in the country.



HOSPITALLIA



Of the thousands of employees who have brought the Grand Hotel to life, no one knows her better than Susan Stein, the hotel's historian. Having worked at the resort for 35 years, Stein earned the nickname "boss lady" from the late Bucky Miller - a legend at the resort. She has worked directly for nine general managers at the Grand Hotel during 25 years in the executive office before being named Grand Historian. Stein oversees the resort archives and is a primary storyteller for the property. She leads history tours and regularly speaks to local civic, community, and military organizations.

"From getting to know Bucky to working with the 40 associates who have worked at the Grand Hotel for more than 25 years to introducing the Grand's history to wideeyed children visiting the resort for the first time, the Grand has so many stories to tell." Sharing copies of guests' signatures from Honeymoon Guest Registries, which date back to 1951, is something she especially enjoys doing. This type of service and hospitality from Stein and the other Grand associates has not gone unnoticed. Historic Hotels of America named the Grand Hotel the top large historic hotel in the country in 2019. USA Today and Southern Living honored the Grand as one of the top resorts in the country for the second year in a row. Stein was a finalist for Historic Hotel's Historian of the Year in 2019.

Before its closing in the 1970s, George Moore worked at The Battle House and knew its traditions and place of prominence. Through tough economic times, the hotel doors closed for more than 30 years. However, once renovated and preparing to reopen, Moore was one of the first people hired to bring "Mobile's Living Room" back to life. He is known by hotel associates and guests alike as Mr. George.

Named Ambassador of the Year in 2013 by Historic Hotels of America, Mr. George is an enthusiastic, dedicated ambassador that exudes Southern Hospitality. His performance has always displayed levels of professionalism and thoroughness, which are truly "a cut above." As the hotel's historian, he has toured thousands of guests through the historic Battle House. Mr. George goes above and beyond in everything he does. So much so, the hotel's gift shop was named


after him. From helping royalty during Mardi Gras to listening to elderly women reminisce about their proms at the hotel to welcoming international business leaders, Mr. George has done it all and done it well. In a time and age of emails and instant contact, Mr. George reminds us of a time that many may not know of or have long since forgotten. He is a teacher of historic hospitality and the art of conversation.

While the other six hotels/resorts along the RTJ Golf Trail may not have official historians, associates will quickly share historical facts about the hotels and the area. The Marriott Shoals' top luxury suites are named after Helen Keller and W.C. Handy, two locals who made a difference internationally. All music played throughout the Marriott Shoals Hotel & Spa was recorded locally and the hotel has live music every night. Muscle Shoals has an active legendary music industry. You never know what legend or newcomer you may pass in the hallways.

While relatively new, the Equal Justice Initiative sites in Montgomery have quickly made a name for themselves. From A-list





ALABAMA'S INTERNATIONAL **ARTIST**

Few Alabamians are known by only one name, but then very few can command the international reputation of the artist Nall. Born Fred Nall Hollis in Troy in 1948, he has been creating art in a variety of genres for more than 50 years, from paintings, mosaics, and line engravings to sculpture, glassware, and jewelry. He grew up in Troy and earned a degree in art, political science, and abnormal psychology from the University of Alabama. He studied at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Paris and was mentored by Salvador Dali. His work has been exhibited in France, Italy, Switzerland, New York, Miami, and many other museums, and he has been an artist in residence at the University of Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Miami-Dade College, and Troy University. After living several years in France and setting up his N.A.L.L. Art Foundation for students, he returned to Alabama, where he now operates out of his studio in Fairhope. He has a permanent art gallery in the International Arts Center on the Troy campus.

Your work is well known to many Alabamians who've seen it in the hotels and properties of the Retirement Systems of Alabama. Do you still supply new artwork to the RSA hotels and buildings? Working with the RSA has been a great part of my career. It gives you a lot of exposure. People go to luxury hotels much more than they go to museums, I met Dr. David G. Bronner (CEO of the Retirement Systems of Alabama) through (Troy University Chancellor) Jack and Janice Hawkins. It's all like a family. They're wonderful, super people. I did all the pieces at the Grand Hotel, and loaned them in 2002 when they did a major renovation. Having completed a massive transformation in 2018, they gave back 1,500 pieces of my art. So now when I go to someone's home I take a little piece of art instead of a bottle of wine. Everybody won! For the Grand's transformation, the resort added a Nall Suite and a connecting gallery overlooking the historic main lobby. I also created large camellia prints for the reception desk wall. Other new pieces are in guest rooms and other locations throughout the resort.

At your studio in Fairhope, do you still work with apprentices? I'm still working with them, using a lot of students from the high school mostly. Every now and then, I'll get one who wants to apprentice for three or four months. That's what I'm looking for. They're helping me, and that is learning (for them) because they're in a professional environment. We paint and frame, learn about inventories, giving interviews with the press, how to make yourself available. I'm teaching them everything I know about everything. How to be a teacher is taught in school. How to be an artist is not. There's a world of difference. First of all, you can't count on any income when you're 65. That's essential to know

when you want to become an artist. You follow your own rules and express from your heart, not your intellect.

You've worked in so many different media. Do you have a favorite? All are my favorite at the time I'm working on them. When I'm working, I'm so concentrated on that, it's absorbing. I have a wonderful ability to have a one-track mind on whatever I'm doing. I can be working and talking on the phone and doing something else at the same time, and still be right there with the work. It's a gift.

Frames have been an important part of your signature look. Absolutely. It's the framework on the pieces that really makes some of them. Whatever you see, you see the framework with it. So, if you put an 18th-century gilded frame around a drawing, the drawings are going to look a heck of a lot better. And if you put a drawing or little painting with tacky little frames, you wouldn't want it. It's an important thing I try to teach my kids. What you're giving the public is an image. The image is inseparable from the frame around it. If you want to have a filthy house with the bed unmade and the curtains ragged and falling down, the house might be great but people who are going into the house will say, "This is awful." It's the same thing with a painting or somebody's clothes.

What are your current projects? I've got three books going on. It's wonderful to be able to change and concentrate on something else. The N.A.L.L. Foundation is going to publish my memoirs. Plus, I'm building a museum down here in Fairhope. I've been told by a spiritual advisor that if you write your memoirs, it's the best way to increase your memory. If I'd known that, I'd have started them 10 years ago. ■





Named the #2 public golf facility in the country by Golf World readers, Capitol Hill continues to get praise from golfers and golf writers alike. GOLF Magazine called the Judge Course one of the 10 public courses in America worthy of hosting the U.S. Open and the Zagat Survey of America's Top Golf Courses ranked it among the top 50 courses in America. The Senator was named among the Top 10 New Courses in the nation by GOLF Magazine and hosts the LPGA's Symetra Tour Guardian Championship each September.

Located in Prattville, just 8 miles north of Alabama's state capitol, Capitol Hill features three 18-hole championship courses. With more than 1,500 acres of golf and nature, the pure magnitude of this facility is amazing and allows each course to be drastically

different from the others. Capitol Hill also features an innovative 360 degree driving range 400 yards in diameter.

The Senator, a Scottish-Links style course, holds more than 140 pot-hole bunkers and mounds 20 to 40 feet in height, hiding the cart path or any other hole from view. New TifEagle Ultradwarf greens were installed on the Senator Course in 2020.

The Legislator, a more traditional course, plays in and out of pine trees and along a bluff overlooking the Alabama River. Enjoy the view riding down the "Sky Bridge" for six holes laid out in a native cypress swamp as you are led back up the bluff to finish the course at the spectacular clubhouse.

The **Judge** offers stunning vistas along 200-acres amongst the backwaters of the Alabama River. The first tee lies 200 feet above the fairway overlooking the river and the Montgomery skyline. With 14 holes adjoining the water and a bulkheaded island green, the Judge is described as simply magnificent.

its laurels. 2016 saw the culmination of a three-year total renovation of the original 27 championship holes set upon the most spectacular setting for golf in the state of Alabama. The Loblolly and Sherling nines were completed in 2013 and 2014. The Canyon nine redesign and reconstruction were completed in 2016. The greens have been redesigned to accommodate the higher greens speeds associated with our installation of the latest generation of Ultradwarf Bermuda grass. Additionally, many of the holes have been totally redesigned to open up views of Sherling Lake and deliver a challenging test of golf while providing players of all skill levels a variety of ways to play each hole and enjoy the experience.

This year on Memorial Day weekend, May 28-29, Cambrian Ridge will host the annual Father/Son Championship, one of the most popular events on the Trail.

The Short Course, not to be overshadowed by the two championship 18's, is a thing of beauty, with more than half the holes touching the lake. This 18-hole course of par 3's might be the finest anywhere in the country.

The Northern gateway to the Trail is Hampton Cove in Huntsville, a 54-hole facility with terrain that drastically changes from one side of the property to the other.

The **Highlands Course** is one of the most picturesque and playable courses on the Trail. Long waving grasses frame dramatically rolling terrain and beautiful bent grass greens. One of the most recognizable landmarks on the Trail is the old mule barn beside the fifth hole, while the finishing holes on the Highlands Course are among the most scenic and challenging on the Trail.

Completely different from the Highlands is the **River Course**, the only Robert Trent Jones layout in the world designed without a single bunker. The River Course is laid out on former soybean fields in the flood plain of the Flint River. The River Course is a throwback to the way courses were built long ago, where



dirt was merely pushed up to create the greens and tees, leaving all else, including massive oak trees, as is. With water in play on 16 of the 18 holes, the River Course will challenge your shot-making ability.

The **Short Course** at Hampton Cove is open and links-like, with water in play on 11 holes. It is a great venue for golfers of all skill levels and alternating tees allow golfers to hit every club in their bag.

stretches to 701 yards from the tips. The 422yard, par-4 9th is arguably the best hole at the site and has a tilted green elevated above a swath of wetlands. The Magnolia nine is well-named: specimen magnolia trees dot the higher ground, reached via a 1,000-foot long wooden bridge spanning a marsh filled with lichen-dappled trees. The feature hole is the 416-yard 5th, where a split-level fairway offers an option off the tee. The Short Course, a 9-hole par 3 designed to accommodate players of all levels, winds through massive pines and features 3 holes with water.

The regressing of the championship nines with TifEagle Ultradwarf greens was completed in 2020, as was the redesign of the practice area with new short game and putting greens.



Magnolia Grove, the most southern location on Alabama's Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail, was recently named one of the "Top 50 Public Courses" by Golf World Magazine readers. The Crossings and Falls courses are also listed in Golf Digest's "Places to Play" as two of the nation's Great Value courses and as "America's Top 50 Affordable Courses."

The topography at Magnolia Grove features creeks, marshland, and lakes with each of the 54 holes carved through indigenous hardwood and pine. The **Crossings Course**, which has hosted both the LPGA Tour and the Korn Ferry Tour Championship, provides an open parklandtype ambiance. Several water features and crushed oyster shell waste areas were added to provide an exciting new look. All 18 feature the acclaimed Mini Verde Ultradwarf greens.

The renovated **Falls Course** reopened in October 2010 as the only par-71 golf course on the Trail. The Falls is characterized by large, liberally contoured Mini Verde greens and massive cloverleaf bunkers. Several holes were entirely redesigned, giving the course a brand-new look.

Golf Digest has named the **Short Course** at Magnolia Grove as the best par-3 course in America. The Short Course, also recently renovated, features several newly designed greens and all-new putting surfaces with Champion Ultradwarf Bermuda grass.

This course is as good as any collection of one-shotters on a championship course.

ROSS BRIDGE was ranked No. 3 by *GOLFWEEK* in 2021 for best courses you can play in Alabama.

Beautifully carved into the rolling terrain of Shannon Valley, the scope of this property will amaze even the most-traveled golfer. Ross Bridge was named one of the top golf resorts in North America by *GOLF Magazine* in 2019 and has been a favorite of *Golf Digest* editors for the past four years.

The course meanders through indigenous landscape and around the 259-room Renaissance Birmingham Ross Bridge Golf Resort & Spa. Ross Bridge is the fifth-longest course in the world but offers multiple tees for golfers of all levels. Symbolic of an old parkland-style course, ten holes play along the banks of two significant lakes connected by a spectacular waterfall dropping 80 feet between the

9th and 18th greens. A gristmill added to the waterfall reflects the history of this old mining site. The beauty and challenge of each hole leads many to believe there is not one signature hole but possibly eighteen.

Like many other Trail courses, the parthree holes are incredible. Considerable elevation changes combine with water or other natural obstructions to get your attention. Large putting surfaces provide many tempting pin locations that will test golfers' approach shots.

From multiple high points on the course, you can see the picturesque view of the 9th and 18th holes with a waterfall tumbling between. The 7th hole offers a par five that traverses a ridge high above

the rest of the course. The 9th will leave you speechless as it is time to decide how daring you are off the tee. A split fairway allows for either a short challenging route along the water's edge or opt for safer play leaving a longer, more difficult approach to the green. Regardless if it is a par 3, 4, or 5, Ross Bridge stands ready for your game!

The Fighting Joe Course at the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail at The Shoals opened August 2004 and was the first Trail course to break 8,000 yards, measuring some 8,092 yards from the black tees. Bordered by duneslike mounds and tall grasses, Fighting Joe, with wide fairways, large and beautifully maintained bent grass greens, can play long, really long if you play the wrong set of tees, but this course is simply good, straightforward golf. You can see where you're going. The question is...can you get there?

Some say the spectacular 17th hole is the signature hole on the course, but the 18th green overlooking Wilson Lake on the Tennessee River will distract you with its beauty, if not its treachery. Travel + Leisure Golf named Fighting Joe one of the top new courses in 2004 for good reason. Long-hitters here will experience a test of champions, but from the correct tee box, all players will enjoy world-class golf.

The **Schoolmaster Course** may be a tougher course than Fighting Joe, but only time will tell. One thing's for sure, it's a shot-maker's golf course with narrower fairways, demanding approaches to well-protected bent grass greens, and still a length of nearly



8,000 yards! It's hard to beat the beauty that the 18th hole holds on the high bluffs over the river, but the waterfall guarding the 2nd green sure comes close. Make sure you've done your homework well, for the Schoolmaster will certainly test all of your skills.

The **2022 Couples Championship** will be held September 2-4 and is limited to the first 56 teams.


